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Public invited to attend presentation by renowned eco-artist

Globally renowned and pioneer eco-artist Lynne Hull will give a presentation on trans-species art on Thursday, April 19, 2012 in the Martin County Commission Chambers. Trans-species art focuses on sculptures that are usable by wildlife or enhance wildlife habitat. Examples of Hull's work include goose nesting platforms, otter habitat, bat houses, two 30-foot-tall osprey nesting platforms, and several desert hydroglyphs. Hull is currently working on eco-art projects in South Florida and Martin County with local eco-artist Jesse Etelson. Etelson was one of the apprentice artists for the 2009 eco-art project sponsored by the Arts Council of Martin County and EcoArt South Florida. Etelson partnered with South Fork High School last year to teach eco-art principles to students.

Hull and Etelson will facilitate a discussion on emerging eco-art projects in South Florida and Martin County. The presentation will be hosted by Growth Management Department Director, Nicki van Vonno, who noted that the County's Comprehensive Growth Management Plan contains policies supporting and promoting eco-art.

The presentation will be in the Commission Chambers at the Martin County Administrative Center at 7:00 p.m. on April 19. The Martin County Administrative Center is located at 2401 SE Monterey Road in Stuart.
