WELCOME FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND THE BOARD CHAIR

As we approach our 30th anniversary, we'd like to pause for a moment and celebrate the 2009/2010 season, a year of triumph for both the Arts Council, Inc. and Martin County's thriving, innovative arts community that continues to inspire at home and beyond.

At the Court House Cultural Center, more than 5,000 visitors experienced a wide range of media, including the extraordinary retrospective exhibition, "Journey of a Marine Artist: Howard Schafer."

We also celebrated the 23rd year of ArtsFest, which returned to its traditional home along East Ocean Boulevard in downtown Stuart. Boosted by media coverage from WPTV Channel 5, we set records in both attendance and donations received at the gates.

This was the first full season in the newly renovated gallery, which was made possible through the fund raising efforts of the Arts Foundation of Martin County's Board of Directors, as well as through gifts from donors, with the Martin County Community Foundation providing the first and largest gift.

Our Arts Education programs flourished, with special projects hosted at Hobe Sound Elementary and South Fork High School. Picture People and the Marvin S. Cone High School Juried Art Show proved once again to be broadly popular with the community.

In year two of the Ecoart Treasure Coast initiative, five local apprentices--under the tutelage of Betsy Damon--furthered their understanding and mastery of an emerging discipline that combines art and science to remediate environmental problems. On Earth Day 2010, the apprentices created and installed floating bio-islands at the Florida Oceanographic Coastal Center, a project designed as an educational model on how the community can improve its local water systems.

Looking ahead to 2010/2011, we are particularly excited about the new season, one where we will both embark on new endeavors and celebrate milestones, such as DREAMS, the Council's 30th Anniversary Gala Concert at the Lyric Theatre (January 22, 2011), and the 25th Marvin S. Cone High School Juried Art Show (May 2011).



Of course, these events would not be possible without the generosity of our community.

As the Arts Council enters its fourth decade, we are eager to build on our history of funding, cultivating and advocating for the arts in Martin County.

Please join us as we strive to fulfill our mission:

To provide advocacy and leadership that inspires participation in and a passion for the arts in our community.

Together, we will make mARTin County a truly revered arts destination like no other!

ARTS IN EDUCATION

The Council strongly believes that a passion for the arts begins in child-hood and that the arts should be a key part of a child's education. Fostering this appreciation for the arts will ensure an audience for the arts, of all kinds, for future generations.

An education in the arts is also increasingly regarded as a key part of the foundation for a stronger economy and workforce in Martin County, the state of Florida and across the nation--a position we proudly endorsed in our op-ed to the Stuart News in December 2009.

Each year, the Council coordinates several events and programs to increase youth participation in the arts.

In May, the 24th annual Marvin S. Cone High School Juried Art Show was held at the Court House Cultural Center Gallery. The event, named after a local writer, poet, artist, entrepreneur and educator, celebrates

the artistic achievements of the county's high school students. The categories for cash awards were photography, painting, sculpture, mixed media/assemblage, printmaking, and drawing.

Roughly 200 local high school students, their teachers, parents, school officials, and sponsors of the event were in attendance. Sponsors included Palm City Art & Frame, Publix Supermarket Charities, Palm Beach Post, ATT--The Real Yellow Pages, Mulligan's Beach House, Seabranch Art League, and Vianne Nichols.

In 2009 and 2010, JD Parker Elementary School and Hobe Sound Elementary School performed "Once Under a Lily Pad." Key support was provided by board member Karen Barnes and artist Brenda Leigh.

Research shows that children educated in the arts receive many benefits from the program besides art awareness, including developing critical thinking skills, improving academic performance, learning to work with a team, and creative expression.

The Court House Cultural Center Gallery Committee plans, curates, installs and strikes exhibitions held in our galleries. Chaired by Osvaldo Monzon, the committee (Paul Aho, Valerie Ambrose, Kevin Boldenow, Petey Cox, David Diaz, Eleanor Epler, Aida Fry, Sheila Geoffrion, Margaret Gray, Maggie Griner, Barbara Icyda, Chris Kling, Andrea Maison, Gail McCarthy, Ellen Nidy, Louise Pocock, Tom Prestopnik, Cheryl Ritland, Paula Rubino, Jean Sanders, and Leslie Stokes) works tirelessly to present high-quality exhibitions.

Go Figure The season began with a juried exhibition titled "Go Figure." Nearly eighty artists competed to have their work featured in this exhibition devoted to the celebration of the human form.

Art-itude Seabranch Art League hosted a membersonly exhibition entitled "Art-itude." The show ushered in the holiday season, and was highlighted during the 24th annual Art is Everywhere Tour, which directed art lovers to homes and sights across the county. The event culminated in a champagne party, complete with music and holiday shopping.

Aho & Marks Exhibits Our next exhibit showcased Jensen Beach resident and artist Paul Aho in the Martin County Community Foundation Gallery, and Florida Keys artist Roberta Marks in the Ayres Gallery. This exhibit was held during the 23rd annual ArtsFest, which drew a record number of visitors and generated donations that the Council needs to fulfill its mission.



Howard Schafer After ringing in the New Year, a spectacular exhibition, "Howard Schafer: Journey of a Marine Artist," attracted a crowd of more than 300 when it opened. In addition, the show featured a new book on the career of Mr. Schafer. This show was the talk of the town.



The New Dedicated to the county's burgeoning community of young artists, seven artists--all under the age of 40--were invited to present for an exhibition titled "The New." The show included works from a range of media, most notably photography and installation art. Women Supporting the Arts funded this exhibit with a grant.

Marvin S. Cone High School

Juried Art Show Fifty-six student artists from Jensen Beach, South Fork and Martin County high schools, the Clark Advanced Learning Center and the Pine School submitted their work for this highly-anticipated annual exhibit. Thirty-five awards were given to students in recognition for their artistic talents.

Thomas Winter & Robert Holland

For the first time in two years, a summer show opened in June. The exhibition show-cased the photography of Thomas Winter and Robert Holland and was a smashing success, with more than 200 people in attendance at the opening reception.

ARTSFEST 2010

The Arts Council's 23rd annual ArtsFest was held March 20 & 21, 2010. This year marked the return of ArtsFest to its traditional home on East Ocean Boulevard.

More than 20,000 visitors filled the streets of downtown Stuart to enjoy and buy works of art from the 150 artists carefully selected from around the country to participate in this year's event. Featured artist Meg Winter's tropical painting set the atmosphere for the event's Caribbean-inspired music and theme.

During the weekend of ArtsFest, visitors received ballots at the gates or at the Council's information kiosk, and were encouraged to vote for a People's Choice Award.

Thanks to our volunteers, sponsors and the record-setting attendance, the Council generated more than \$32,000 at the event. Funds raised through ArtsFest support the ongoing programs of the Council, including arts information activities, arts education programs for youth, and support for artists and arts organizations.

In the fall of 2010, the Ecoart Treasure Coast project will enter the final stage of a two-year apprentice-ship. When the project concludes, Martin County will be home to local artists fully trained in the ecoart practice, an interdisciplinary medium that combines art and science to solve local ecological problems.

Ecoart Treasure Coast is administered by the Arts Council, Inc. and EcoArt South Florida, Inc. and is funded by the Community Foundation of Palm Beach and Martin Counties, the State of Florida (Department of State, Division of Cultural Affairs), and private donations. Six apprentices--Gail Kosowski, Brenda Leigh, Jamie Powell, Mary Segal, Jennifer Sylvia and Cristina de la Vega--have worked alongside the New York City-based ecoartist Betsy Damon over the last year. It is the first ever ecoart education and apprenticeship in the state of Florida.

The project was launched in early 2009, and in April of that year, a symposium of the nation's leading ecoart thinkers and practitioners gathered on the Stuart campus of Indian River State College for a four-day symposium of lectures, panel discussions, and film screenings. Then in November, local artists were selected to participate in the yearlong apprenticeship.

Since January 2010, Damon and the apprentices have forged partnerships with local non-profit organizations and businesses, including Audubon of Martin County, the Marine Resources Council, the Environmental Studies Center, Florida Oceanographic Society, Saturn of Stuart, Ram Real Estate, and many others.

The project's studio and "idea foundry" is located in Palm City.

On Earth Day 2010, the apprentices installed a series of bio-islands at the Florida Oceanographic Coastal Center on Hutchinson Island. The islands, which are made of coconuts and lined with plants native to Florida, will help filtrate the freshwater lagoon at FOS and provide shade, nutrients and habitat.

Though the program will officially wind down in early 2011, we expect the apprentices to continue their work, collaborating with the best and brightest from our schools, businesses, non-profit organizations, and art studios as they create citizen-driven solutions that will ultimately make the Treasure Coast a more beautiful, healthy, and sustainable community.







The seventh mARTies Awards Luncheon was held on April 1, 2010 at the Marriott Resort on Hutchinson Island.

There were seven mARTies categories, and nominees were judged by three criteria: artistic excellence, civic responsibility, and leadership in improving the quality of life in our community.

In addition to the competitivelynominated awards, the Board of Directors reviewed nominees from several named award categories. A complete list of previous winners-dating back to 2003-can be found on the Council's Web site: www.martinarts.org.

Inspired by the belief that our community is strengthened by the integration of art into some of its most visible spaces, Martin County established a public art program in 1997: Art in Public Places. Through sculptures, mobiles, stained glass windows, murals, mosaics, benches, photographs, and quilts, which can be found in libraries, fire stations, community centers, administration buildings, parks, and other county-owned properties, our community enjoys a cornucopia of public art.

The mission of Art in Public Places is to enhance the quality of the visual environment in the Martin County community, both natural and constructed, in order to:

- Promote the spiritual, intellectual and aesthetic enrichment of the community through public art;
- Select a diversity of public art for Martin County;
- Select works of art which have aesthetic and technical merit and are appropriate in context to the location;
- Select artists who are professionally and technically competent;
- Disperse public art throughout Martin
 County in such a manner that it is visible
 and accessible to the greatest number of
 people.

Martin County Commissioners appoint nine members to a Public Art Advisory Board who in turn evaluate applications and ultimately approve the final artwork. The program is supported by an allocation of one percent of the construction cost of a new or remodeled county buildings, regional parks more than 50 acres, and parking facilities.

One notable project in 2010 involved a group of Jensen Beach High School students working under the direction of Brenda Leigh, a Stuart-based muralist. In the summer, Leigh and the students worked on a three-dimensional mosaic on the surface of the restrooms at Stuart Beach ("The Living Reef"). In the fall, Leigh will spearhead the installation of a project in Hobe Sound that's devoted to nesting sea turtles.



THE ARTS FOUNDATION

The Arts Foundation was created to support the Council's programs and services. The Foundation is a subsidiary corporation to the Council. Its Board of Directors are appointed by the Council's Board to serve the primary mission of advancing the financial stability for the Council and the arts as a growing industry in Martin County.

There are three primary funds to which a donor may contribute to the Foundation: unrestricted endowment fund, fields of interest

funds, and designated funds. Most recently, the Foundation's board members oversaw the capital campaign to renovate the Court House Cultural Center Gallery.

The first phase of the project included new wood flooring, refurbished walls and the installation of a/v equipment.

Phase two was devoted to a new ceiling, lighting, upgrades of the entryway and the construction of a volunteer station.

Thanks to the generosity of many in our community, the Gallery was fully renovated in 2009 and attracted more than 5,000 visitors last season. Among the campaign's key supporters were:

WOMEN SUPPORTING THE ARTS (WSA)



W/omen Supporting the Arts (WSA) is the Arts Foundation's most active program. Its mission is to build a community of women philanthropists who inspire, educate and encourage women to strengthen the arts and cultural environment throughout Martin County.

Since 2004, WSA has provided 86 grant awards, totaling \$116,000 for arts-related programs, projects,

scholarships and internships throughout Martin County.

The annual granting process begins with the receipt of grant applications in late September and grant awards are awarded in early January. Criteria for grant applicants--as well as the application form--can be found on our Web site (www.martinarts.org).

LICENSE PLATE GRANTS PROGRAM

The Council's License Plate Grant program was designed to foster support for arts education programs and strengthen outreach to underserved areas of our community.

When residents of Martin County purchase an Arts License Plate, they are helping the Council broaden its support for artistic and cultural program and projects.



One notable program that was awarded funding at the Council's December meeting was the Samaritan House for Boys' "drama therapy through theater" program

for boys ages six to twelve years old. The boys participating in the program learned script writing, creating costumes, building props and sets, and giving performances.



Launched in 1994, the program has invested more than \$130,000 in arts programs throughout the Treasure Coast.

In December 2009 and May 2010, the Council's Board of Directors approved \$8,325 in grants that will help support a range of local arts programs and projects. Many of the programs are collaborative efforts, involving strategic partnerships between the Council, the county's designated local arts agency, and other arts organizations such as Florida Arts & Dance Company and the Treasure Coast Music Teachers Association.




