Our staff team welcomed three new members this year, Tori Hill, Kailene Chua and Stephanie Schubert. Each filled a slot that was vacated, for a variety of reasons including a retirement. I am glad to have all three of these talented employees joining our creative team!





What we've accomplished so far...

- Our successful Cornerstone fund raising initiative plus grant support has raised over \$350,000, nearly 100% of the funds needed for the preliminary planning of the project: feasibility study, architectural plans, structural assessment (including hazardous materials), and historic structures report.
- Created a team of experts to support the project including Jeff Hardin, Straticon Construction; Joe Cooper, GA Construction Group; Tom Lucido, Lucido & Associates; Mike Nelson, MNArchitects; Ed Dugger, ED+A Acoustics; William B. Medellin, historic preservation specialists; and Joe Capra, CAPTEC Engineering who work with volunteers including Liz Bonan, John Eriksen, Dan Brady, Dave Schoonover, Tom Pence, and MJ Dowling.
- Developing a pro-forma budget and operating plan with support from Judith Mitchell, Sharon Holt, Neil Capozzi, Alicia Weber, and Nina Nicolosi.
- MartinArts has secured an intent to lease from the Martin County School District for a long term lease with a lease (50+ years) to follow.
- Partnership agreements are in place with the School District, specifically Stuart Middle School, and the Boys & Girls Clubs of Martin County as we look to collaborate on programming and enhanced learning opportunities for our community's youth.

Rooted in our community since 1988, ArtsFest is a much loved annual celebration of the arts. Held February 10 & 11, 2024, ArtsFest celebrated the culinary, visual and performing arts. It was an exciting year as we launched "Art Speaks" a poetry slam hosted by Stella B, welcomed Parrotheads from across the region for the performance by the Landsharks, a Jimmy Buffet tribute band, and hosted a middle school chalk art competition with support from the State of Florida, Division of Arts & Culture.

Annually, ArtsFest draws at least 7,500 people during the two day event, recruits 150+ volunteers to serve, and promoted more than 200 artists from across the visual, literary, culinary and performing arts disciplines.

Our mission, as the local arts agency, includes promoting the arts to build an audience for today, and inspire the audience of tomorrow.



Martin County's Economic Impact of the Arts = \$31M

AEP6 was the sixth economic impact study of the nonprofit arts and culture industry in the U.S. This study is conducted approximately every five years to gauge the economic impact (on employment, government revenue, and household income) of spending by nonprofit arts and culture organizations and the event-related spending by their audiences. Previous studies were published in 1994, 2002, 2007, 2012, and 2017. Martin County was one of 300+ communities across the country who participated.











Operating Income & Expenses* - FY 2023-2024
